## NOMINATION

- Nomination deadline Fall semester (SEPT-JAN) May 1st
- Nomination deadline Spring semester (FEB-JUN) November 1st

Students can apply through our online application system. When the application is complete, the students will be registered then receive a login name and password.

- Application deadline Fall semester (SEPT-JAN) May 15th
- Application deadline Spring semester (FEB-JUN) November 15th

## DUTCH GRADING SYSTEM

A student's workload (both contact hours and hours spent studying and preparing assignments) is measured in ECTS credits. According to Dutch law one credit represents 28 hours of work and 60 credits represent one year of full time study. The grading system has remained the same for several decades: the scale is from 1 (very poor) to 10 (outstanding). The lowest passing grade is 5.5; 9's are seldom given and 10's are extremely rare. Sometimes decimal grades are used (e.g. 7.8).

## IMMIGRATION INFORMATION

<b>Non-EU-students</b>	Whether students have to apply for a visa/MVV before entering the Netherlands depends on their nationality. For more info on how to apply for a visa, <a href="#">click here</a> .
<b>NON EU- students who have to apply for a visa/ MVV and a residence permit BEFORE coming to the Netherlands are among others: Brazil/ Chile/ China/ Hong Kong/ Malaysia/ Mexico/ Russia/ Singapore/ Taiwan/ Turkey/Thailand</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Applications for a student visa and residence permit can only be done through a Dutch educational institution. Students can't apply for it themselves.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The International Students Administration will send the student an e-mail with information regarding the study visa/residence permit and an invoice for the IND fee (Dutch Immigration Services). The fee for the visa/residence permit application is € 207,-*.</li><li>• There are some forms that have to be filled in by the student. After receipt of the documents and the payment, the International Students Administration will apply for the visa and residence permit on behalf of the student.</li></ul></li><li>2. In order to obtain a visa and residence permit, students have to prove the disposal of sufficient financial means for the duration of their stay (€ 11.200,-* (for a year), € 5.600,- *(one semester).</li><li>3. Students will be informed as soon as the IND has decided about their application.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Students can then make an appointment at the Dutch embassy in their own country in order to apply for the student visa. The residence permit card can be picked up at the IND office shortly after arrival in the Netherlands.</li></ul></li></ol>
<b>Non-EU-students for whom it's not necessary to apply for a visa before entry in the netherlands, are amongst others: Japan/South-Korea/Canada/USA</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Applications for a student residence permit can only be done through a Dutch educational institution. Students can't apply for it themselves.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The International Students Administration will send the student an e-mail with information regarding the residence permit and an invoice for the IND fee (Dutch Immigrations Services). The fee for the IND (= Immigration Services) is €207,-*.</li><li>• There are some forms that have to be filled in by the student. After receipt of the documents and the payment, the International Students Administration will apply for the visa and residence permit on behalf of the student.</li></ul></li><li>2. In order to obtain a visa and residence permit, students have to prove the disposal of sufficient financial means for the duration of their stay € 11.200,-* (for a year), € 5.600,- *(one semester).</li><li>3. After arrival: students will have to go to the IND office to have their biometrical data taken. The residence permit card can be picked up at the IND office shortly after the biometrical data have been taken.</li></ol>
